



Declaration of admission to the Brazilian Coalition on Climate, Forests and Agriculture

The **Brazilian Coalition on Climate, Forests and Agriculture** is a multisector movement that brings together companies, civil society organizations, academics and individuals, and that recognizes existing opportunities and synergies between agriculture and the protection, conservation and sustainable use of forests agenda as a great source of potential in Brazil for the mitigation of climate change.

Its main goal is to develop a new economy, in a sustainable and competitive base, which enables the achievement of concrete advancements for the agenda on climate, forests and agriculture and livestock in Brazil, as well as generate business opportunities and promote greater environmental conservation in the country.

**ANNEX 1 – PROPOSALS ADOPTED - VOLUNTARILY AND UNDER NO LEGAL OBLIGATION –
BY THE BRAZILIAN COALITION ON CLIMATE, FORESTS AND AGRICULTURE**

The signatory companies and organizations of the Brazilian Coalition on Climate, Forests and Agriculture pledge to:

1. Comply with deadlines for implementing the Brazilian Forest Code, especially with regard to the Environmental Rural Registry and the commitments to be assumed under the Environmental Regularization Program.
2. Promote compliance with the Brazilian Forest Code in their supply chain.
3. Ensure there is no illegal deforestation in their productive chains.
4. Ensure zero net deforestation in their supply chains.
5. In company purchases of native forest products, require proof that the wood is legally controlled or certified. Require guarantees of traceability for products from sustainably managed native forests, as soon as the system is introduced.
6. Compile inventories of greenhouse gas emissions and create action plans to mitigate these emissions.



ANNEX 2 - BRAZILIAN COALITION'S INTERNAL PROCESSES FOR APPLICATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS AND SUSPENSION OR EXCLUSION OF PARTICIPANTS

Cases of non-compliance or denounces, that put at risk the precepts of sustainable and ethical practices included in the "Declaration of admission" may compromise the admission of the entity to the movement or result in the suspension or exclusion of the participant, until it is possible to prove their adjustments to the commitments declared.

Admission Process

Applications for new admissions will be reviewed by the Coalition Executive Group (GX), whereby it must assess whether the applicant meets the criteria of the "Declaration of admission" and whether it can form part of the movement.

If the request is accepted, the entity becomes part of the Coalition, and its admission will be notified to all members through the newsletter. If GX does not approve the admission, the Coalition Strategic Group (GE) will be informed and an official response will be sent to the applicant.

Process of suspension or exclusion

Requests for the suspension or exclusion of a participating entity can be made through the manifestation of any member of the Brazilian Coalition. GE will then assess whether the request is well founded and decides on how to proceed. The suspension of a participant is always temporary. In cases of exclusion, the participant may request the re-admission to the movement after a one-year period.

The new members admission, suspension or exclusion processes aim to safeguard the image and reputation of the movement and its flags.
